But speaking the truth in love, we must grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, from whom the whole body, joined and knit together by every ligament with which it is equipped, as each part is working properly, promotes the body's growth in building itself up in love.

Sermon The Most Reverend Michael B. Curry, Presiding Bishop and Primate of The Episcopal Church

The Rector of St. Patrick's Cathedral presents a Bible, saying Dean, receive this Bible, and be among us as one who proclaims the Word. *People* **Amen**.

The Clergy of St. Bartholomew's Church present a stole and tippet, saying Dean, receive this stole and tippet, and be among us as a pastor and priest. *People* **Amen**.

The Wardens present the keys to the church, saying

Dean, receive these keys, and let the doors of this place be open to all people. *People* **Amen**.

St. Bart's Lay Ministers present The Book of Common Prayer, saying Dean, receive this Book of Common Prayer, and be among us in our life of worship. *People* **Amen**.

The Prayer Team presents a refurbished kneeler, saying

Dean, receive this kneeler, and be among us as a person of prayer.

People **Amen**.

The Dean of the Midtown Clericus of the Diocese of New York presents the Constitution and Canons of this Church, saying

Dean, obey these Canons, and be among us to share in the councils of this diocese. *People* **Amen**.

The Altar Guild presents bread and wine, saying

Dean, take this bread and wine, and be among us to break the Bread and bless the Cup. *People* **Amen**.

The Musicians of St. Bartholomew's Church present a hymn, newly composed by the Director of Music, saying Dean, receive this hymn, and inspire us as we seek to perfect the praises of Almighty God with the gifts our Creator has entrusted to us.

People **Amen**.

Crossroads/Community Ministry presents an apron, saying Dean, accept this apron, and teach us to serve faithfully the hungry and homeless. *People* **Amen**.

The Welcome Committee presents a name button, saying Dean, accept your name button, and join us in welcoming all people to this parish.

People **Amen**.

The St. Bart's Preschool presents art created by the Preschool children, saying Dean, accept this artwork with love from the Preschool children, and lead us to be a joyful school. *People* **Amen**.

St. Bart's Children, Youth, and Families present a children's Bible and youth confirmation book, saying Dean, accept these books, and be among us as we grow together in faith and love. *People* **Amen**.

Bishop Dean, let all these be signs of the ministry which is mine and yours in this place. *People* **Amen**.

The Rector kneels in the midst of the church, saying

O Lord my God, I am not worthy to have you come under my roof; yet you have called your servant to stand in your house, and to serve at your altar. To you and to your service I devote myself, body, soul, and spirit. Fill my memory with the record of your mighty works; enlighten my understanding with the light of your Holy Spirit; and may all the desires of my heart and will center in what you would have me do. Make me an instrument of your salvation for the people entrusted to my care, and grant that I may faithfully administer your holy Sacraments, and by my life and teaching set forth your true and living Word. Be always with me in carrying out the duties of my ministry. In prayer, quicken my devotion; in praises, heighten my love and gratitude; in preaching, give me readiness of thought and expression; and grant that, by the clearness and brightness of your holy Word, all the world may be drawn into your blessed kingdom. All this I ask for the sake of your Son our Savior Jesus Christ. *Amen.*

The Bishop continues We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore, according to his command, O Father,

Bishop and People We remember his death, We proclaim his resurrection, We await his coming in glory;

And we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, O Lord of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine.

We pray you, gracious God, to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts that they may be the Sacrament of the Body of Christ and his Blood of the new Covenant. Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice, that we may be acceptable through him, being sanctified by the Holy Spirit. In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us to that heavenly country where, with all your saints, we may enter the everlasting heritage of your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation.

By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. **AMEN**.

If you require a gluten-free wafer, ask the priest when the bread is offered to you.

- If you wish to receive but are unable to come forward, let your usher know, and Communion will be brought to you.
- If you do not wish to receive Communion, you are welcome to come forward for a blessing, indicated by crossing your arms over your chest.
