

ABOUT TODAY'S LITURGY AND MUSIC

Mark's Gospel this Sunday tells us of Jesus' preaching and deeds of curing the sick and healing while visiting Nazareth, his hometown, and how the Nazareans were astounded. To underscore these acts of love, St. Bartholomew's Choir will offer Ned Rorem's anthem "Sing, my soul his wondrous love," a setting of a hymn by an unknown early 19th-century author, whose words have inspired American congregations since its inclusion in *Hymns and Spiritual Songs* (Baltimore) in 1801. American composer, Ned Rorem, who won the Pulitzer Prize in 1976, is a prolific composer with great works in most genres including symphonic, chamber, vocal and choral music. He is also a well-known diarist, whose controversial writing "raised some eyebrows" in the 1960's-1990's.

The choir will also offer music of two important American church musicians, Harold Friedell and Jeffrey Smith. Friedell served St. Bartholomew's Church as its organist and choirmaster from 1946-1958. With its modal harmony and chant-shaped lines, his Communion Service in F Major was greatly influenced by the music of Ralph Vaughan Williams. Jeffrey Smith has served the church of St. Paul's K Street in Washington, DC and Grace Cathedral in San Francisco, CA. His setting of "Humbly I adore thee" is a set of choral variations on the hymn tune which includes a skillful variation in motet style and a final variation with a soaring soprano descant.

FREE PARKING: We provide parking free of charge for Sunday services. The garage is on the south side of East 51st Street (between 3rd and Lexington Avenues). Ask an usher or someone at St. Bart's Central for a voucher. (Because some have asked, please note that each redeemed parking voucher costs St. Bart's \$12.)

INTERCESSORY PRAYERS: Available during communion at the 9 and 11 am services.

ACCESSIBLE ST. BART'S: Our ramped entrance through the garden is currently out of service. As an alternative, the entrance at 109 East 50th street is available on Sunday mornings. Accessible restrooms are located off the lobby inside the Park Avenue entrance. Large-print service leaflets (and Books of Common Prayer) are available at our welcome desk in the lobby.
