## ABOUT TODAY'S LITURGY AND MUSIC

At 9 am, St. Bart's Singers will offer Gordon Young's "Now let us all praise God and sing," one of the most popular American anthems composed in the 20th century. Young attended both Southwestern College in Winfield, KS and the Curtis Institute of Music in Philadelphia. Throughout his lifetime, Young published over 800 works and received 18 consecutive composition awards from ASCAP—The American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers.

At 11 am, St. Bartholomew's Boy and Girl Choristers will be commissioned as they prepare to embark on their pilgrimage to Exeter Cathedral, where they will be in residence singing for daily services at the Cathedral. They will offer repertoire from their upcoming trip including Richard Shephard's Communion Service in D. Shephard is one of the most significant composers of Anglican church music today. He began his career at Gloucester Cathedral as a chorister under the composer and organist Herbert Sumsion. As a student at Corpus Christi College in Cambridge he studied with David Willcocks and Alan Ridout. His extraordinary acumen is not limited to music. He currently serves as Director of Development at York Minster. His Communion Service in D is dedicated to his choirmaster, Herbert Sumsion.

**FREE PARKING:** We provide parking free of charge for Sunday services. The garage is on the south side of East 51st Street (between 3rd and Lexington Avenues). Ask an usher or someone at St. Bart's Central for a voucher. (Because some have asked, please note that each redeemed parking voucher costs St. Bart's \$12.)
