ABOUT TODAY'S LITURGY AND MUSIC

On some Sundays, our lectionary (schedule of readings) includes a Canticle rather than one of the Psalms. A canticle is biblical song, other than the Psalms. These include the Song of Mary, the *Magnificat* (which we will sing on the Fourth Sunday of Advent), the Song of Simeon (*Nunc dimittis*, heard at Evensong services), the Te Deum, Jubilate, and others. This morning we will sing the Song of Zechariah in a metrical translation, "Blessed Be the God of Israel" to the familiar folk tune *Kingsfold*.

Throughout the season of Advent, the 9 am and 5 pm services include music to reflect upon the coming of the Lord and the ruminative and anticipatory character of the season. These include the hymn "There's a voice in the wilderness crying," the prayer response "Wait for the Lord," and, at 9 am, the Advent Wreath prayer chanted by the choir as the wreath is lit at the start of each Sunday.
