Today, St. Bart's Singers offer "The King's Highway" by Lee Hastings Bristol, Jr. After a very successful career with the Bristol-Meyers Company (the family business), Dr. Bristol, an outstanding layman of the Episcopal Church, composer and educator, served as president of Westminster Choir College, Princeton. He was a member of the Joint Commission on Church Music, paving the way for The Hymnal 1982.

He also commissioned a series of organ works based on hymns new since the 1940 hymnal, including Gerre Hancock's prelude on "Come, thou fount of every blessing." Before serving St. Thomas Church as organist & master of the choristers from 1971 to 2004, Dr. Hancock was assistant organist at St. Bartholomew's (1960–62).
