Love and Resistance—Stonewall After 50 Years: The 2019 World Pride celebration in New York City marks the fiftieth anniversary of the Stonewall riots, the demonstrations in Greenwich Village that paved the way for more recent advances in LGBTQ+ equality nationally and worldwide. Jason Baumann, the curator of a Stonewall exhibit at the New York Public Library and the editor of two books on the riots, reflects on the defining events of the summer of 1969 and how they might inform our ongoing struggle for justice.

ABOUT TODAY'S LITURGY AND MUSIC

The music at the 9 am service today includes Grayston Ives's setting of George Herbert's *Listen Sweet Dove*. Ives has had a varied and interesting career, which began as a boy chorister at Ely Cathedral. He is a consummate singer, having sung tenor at Guilford Cathedral, and for eight years on the concert stages of the world as a member of The King's Singers. His interest in composition goes back to his school days. During his last year at Ely, he was able to show some of his compositions to Benjamin Britten who later wrote him an enormously encouraging letter. Describing his own work, Ives says he "favors a style which blends color, vitality, and freshness with warmth and lyricism."

Listen Sweet Dove sets George Herbert's poem *Whitsunday* and was originally part of a larger service of music and readings for Whit Sunday (i.e. Pentecost).

At 11 am, St. Bartholomew's Choir will sing *Missa Secunda* of Hans Leo Hassler (1564-1612). In 1584, Hassler was in the first of a wave of German composers who travelled to Italy to continue their training; he studied Venice with the *maestro di capella* at St. Mark's Basilica, Andrea Gabrieli. He eventually returned to his native Nuremburg when he served as *Kapellmeister* or director of town music. He later served as *Kapellmeister* at Dresden. His Masses are characterized by light melodies juxtaposed with the grace and fluidity of the madrigal style.

FREE PARKING: We provide parking free of charge for Sunday services. The garage is on the south side of East 51st Street (between 3rd and Lexington Avenues). Ask an usher or someone at St. Bart's Central for a voucher. (Because some have asked, please note that each redeemed parking voucher costs St. Bart's \$15.)
