St Bartholomew's Church, located at 325 Park Avenue and 51st Street, in the heart of midtown Manhattan, is a large, dynamic and progressive urban parish of the Episcopal Diocese of New York. Our mission is to comfort, challenge and inspire a growing community of people in search of meaning and hope in their lives. St Bart's offers a "radical welcome" to all people, no matter their gender, gender identity, race, orientation, or socio-economic status. St Bart's invites all to become fully engaged in the life and mission of the church. We are, first and foremost, a spiritual home, but we also provide services to those in need. In addition, we offer creative and educational programs for adults, youth, and families, as well as a forum for art, culture, and social interaction. Our facility houses a pre-school, swimming pool, gym, restaurant and our Sanctuary.

Families engage with St Bart's through multiple avenues as they gather for monthly events to encourage fellowship and learning. Our preschool connects neighborhood families to the life of the church, while music connects many families through our chorister program.

Minister for Children, Youth and Family Formation

The Minister for Children, Youth and Family Formation will lead and support the overall Christian faith formation of children, youth and families in the Episcopal tradition. The Minister will establish a Family Ministry Council and incorporate it into the planning of family ministries. S/he will not only oversee the programmatic needs, and the advocacy for families within the church, but will engage with the clergy team in the care of families and the development of liturgies and practices that impact them.

Responsibilities include:

- Execute all aspects of CYF as needed, including the supervision and training of childcare staff to insure excellence and best practices as it relates to Safe Church.
- Provide support as needed to our 6-12 graders thru Sunday school programs and other activities throughout the year.
- Develop curriculum for the children's chapel service on Sundays; work with and assist as needed with the youth acolytes; lead weekly chapel instruction for the Preschool
- Perform other duties as assigned or required

- Diplomatic, ethical and responsible with the highest level of integrity.
- Genuine passion for our mission, and for our families.
