## ABOUT TODAY'S LITURGY AND MUSIC

"Wana Baraka," a popular Kenyan hymn, will be sung at our 9 am service in an arrangement by Shawn Kirchner. Kirchner learned the song through a delegation of Kenyans who participated in the 1994 Agricultural Missions International Consultation in Sogakope, Ghana. His arrangement features extensive rhythmic play on the word "Alleluia."

At 11 am, we will hear the "Deutsche Liturgie" of Felix Mendelssohn. Composed in 1846 on a commission from Prussia's King Friedrich Wilhelm IV, Mendelssohn's goal was to create a simplified, prayerful setting of the Mass that would not distract congregants. Much of the music of the previous generation of composers (such as Haydn and Mozart) was thought to be too operatic and unsuitable for both Protestant and Catholic worship.

**FREE PARKING:** We provide parking free of charge for Sunday services. The garage is on the south side of East 51st Street (between 3rd and Lexington Avenues). Ask an usher or someone at St. Bart's Central for a voucher. (Because some have asked, please note that each redeemed parking voucher costs St. Bart's \$12.)
